11.) What is the manner of receiving the sacrament of Confirmation?

1. The Bishop will lead the candidates in the renewal of baptismal promises and invoke the Holy Spirit.
2. The candidate will then stand before the Bishop, with their sponsor who places his/her right hand on the candidates shoulder and announce their Confirmation name loudly.
3. The Bishop will anoint the candidate's forehead with Oil of Chrism, saying: "the candidates. Confirmation name, be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit."
4. The candidate responds, "Amen."
5. The Bishop will then say to the candidate: "Peace is with you,"
6. The candidate will respond, "And with your spirit."

12.) Do they want to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation? If so, why do you want to be Confirmed?

This is the candidates own personal answer. At this point in Confirmation preparation, the candidates answer should not be because their parents want them to or are forcing them but WHY do THEY want the sacrament. If they do not want the sacrament then this must be noted and a conversation with parents must be had between DRE, Parents, and teen.
