





# Reflect &

## **Mission and Evangelization by Opening the Word**

In the first reading from the last chapter of the prophet Isaiah, we get a vision of Jerusalem as the mother of the remnant, those who survive the tribulations of the Babylonian conquest and exile. But it is simultaneously a vision of a renewed Jerusalem in the “new heavens and new earth” that are promised for the future: “For behold I create Jerusalem a rejoicing, and her people a joy” (Isaiah 65:1718, RSV). This promised new heavens and new earth, with Jerusalem as its capital, has already arrived in a provisional form in the arrival of Christ and his kingdom, when “the LORD’s power shall be known to his servants,” but it is also promised to the Church of the end time when God’s enemies will be confounded and his faithful ones vindicated as those from all nations are united in peace.

Isaiah 66:7 uses the image of labor pains. Those who have suffered the tribulations of invasion and exile are invited to see these as labor unto birth. And, in fact, the author seems to suggest a birth like that which is traditionally assigned to Mary: “Before she was in labor she gave birth; before her pain came upon her she was delivered of a son” (RSV). At that time, the Body of Christ, the Church, will be delivered from her trials and they will give way to a time (or an eternity) when our “bodies flourish like the grass” and we are cared for by our loving God “as a mother comforts her child.” May his kingdom come!

In St. Paul’s letter, as in the first reading, we have an ending. St. Paul closes his letter to the Galatians by returning to basics. The argument he has been making is that God’s work in the people of Israel has given birth to some-

thing new in Christ, who in his death has signaled the end of the obligations of that older covenant and announced the establishment of a new one in him. In this sense, not only has that older order been transformed into a new one, but the whole of the “world has been crucified to me,” Paul says, “and I to the world.” That yields not just a new religious system or set of rules but a “new creation.” To nature has been added a super nature, a grace, about the full effects of which Revelation says, “Behold, I make all things new” (21:5).

It is “a rule,” he says, that has made meaningless circumcision or uncircumcision, the old signs of being a Jew or Gentile. This new rule bears “peace and mercy” for us. Finally, there is some controversy among scholars as to whether the “Israel of God” he refers to here is a reference to the Jews or to the Christian Church as a kind of new Israel of God. But in one sense, that confusion can be instructive. His whole argument has been that the older has given birth to the new and that God’s plan is a unity in which the deep mysteries of Israel and its history are now brought to light in Christ and his Church. The whole point of Galatians is, in fact, that in the Church there is no longer Jew and Gentile but only the one Israel of God.

In the Gospel reading, in addition to the Twelve, Jesus also appoints seventy or seventy-two others to serve, we might say, as “advance men” for his own ministry. But by their very number we see that the “kingdom of God” that Jesus instructs them to announce means that the role of Israel—especially through a messianic figure that Isaiah calls the servant of Yahweh—to be “a light to the nations” is coming to fulfillment (Isaiah 42:6 and 49:6). In Jewish tradition, seventy (or seventy-two) is the number of the nations descended from Noah and his sons after the flood

(Genesis 10) and the number of the offspring of Jacob who went with him into Egypt (Exodus 1:5).

Deuteronomy 32:8 even seems to connect these two, saying, "When the Most High gave to the nations their inheritance, when he separated the sons of men, he fixed the bounds of the peoples according to the number of the sons of God [that is, Jacob]" (RSV). So the seventy of Israel is God's "portion" (Deuteronomy 32:9) of the seventy nations, and specially set aside for his purpose to bring the truth of his covenant love (Isaiah 42:6) to the world. As Isaiah 49:6 (RSV) puts it, "I will give you as a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the end of the earth." When Jesus sends out these new elders of Israel, he is telling his people that the kingdom, now "at hand," will reach to the nations!

## Gospel Meditation

Place yourself with the disciples as Jesus prepares to send them out for mission. Listen carefully to the instructions of Jesus. Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals; and greet no one along the way.

Eat and drink what is offered to you, for the laborer deserves his payment. Cure the sick and say to them, "The kingdom of God is at hand for you."

As you hear these words, what is going through your mind? What part is the hardest for you to accept? Why? Now ask yourself, "Am I fully committed to receiving the message of Christ and sharing that message with others? Do I believe that I am capable of doing what Jesus is asking?" Ask Jesus to show you the areas in your life where you do not fully receive and share the message of Christ. Listen for a prompting of the Holy Spirit in response to your prayer.

When you think of the word "evangelization," what images or phrases typically come to mind? Regardless, what qualities make a good evangelizer? Let's make a list of some of these qualities.

Choose one area of your life where it is difficult for you to joyfully witness to Christ's peace. Ask Jesus for the grace to live more joyfully in that area and make steps this week to do so.

## Decimocuarto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

3 de julio de 2016



Las lecturas de hoy celebran la providencia de Dios. No importa lo maravilloso (o doloroso) que sean nuestras relaciones, Dios siempre nos provee. Nadie cuida tanto de nosotros como lo hace Dios.

Isaías nos deleita con una imagen profundamente íntima de Dios cuidándonos "como una madre cuida de su hijo". El profeta nos describe no como los habituales "hijos de Dios" sino como "bebés". No debemos resistirnos a esta imagen, sino regocijarnos con ella. Confiado en el cuidado de Dios, nosotros podemos bajar la guardia y descansar como bebés en el regazo de nuestra madre.

La confianza de san Pablo en Dios le permite estar en paz. Audazmente dice que nadie puede "ponerle obstáculos" por que se ha entregado completamente a Jesús. Y cuando Jesús envía a sus discípulos a predicar y sanar, él los desafía a no cargar nada para ellos, sino tener fe en su guía.

### NUNCA SOLOS

San Pablo nos recuerda hoy que él lleva en su cuerpo "la marca de los sufrimientos de Cristo". Podemos recordar otra carta en la que Pablo describe sus encarcelamientos y golpes: "cinco veces a manos de los judíos recibí cuarenta latigazos menos uno. Tres veces fui golpeado con varas, una vez fui apedreado, tres veces naufragué, pasé una noche y un día en lo profundo (2 Corintios 11:24-25). Más allá de amargarse por estas circunstancias, Pablo "alarde" en la cruz que Jesús le permitió compartir.

Aquellos de nosotros que tenemos cicatrices, también tenemos las historias que nos causaron la cicatriz. Las cicatrices de Pablo le recuerdan la vida de Jesús. Con las marcas de Jesús en su cuerpo y el amor de Cristo en su corazón, Pablo nunca está sólo.

### PROFUNDAMENTE CONECTADO

Nunca estamos solos; bueno no siempre. Vivimos en relaciones, en comunidad. Esa es la forma como llegamos al

mundo, después de todo, con una mamá en parto que nos da a luz a la comunidad. Dios -Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo- es una comunidad misteriosa que tiene la intención que vivamos en relación con Dios y con los demás, siempre y por la eternidad. Las historias de abandono o abuso nos afecta fuertemente precisamente porque todos sabemos la profundidad necesidad humana que abarca a una familia amorosa.

Hoy en nuestra lectura de Isaías describe a Dios como una madre gentil, dedicándonos tiempo, a sus hijos y confortándonos. Este Dios mismo nos cuida tan íntimamente que elige entrar a la familia humana por medio de María. Jesús, su hijo, creció fuerte al lado de su cuidado. Y como Lucas nos dice hoy, cuando el tiempo llegó para anunciar el mensaje de su Evangelio, Jesús insistió en la comunidad: él envió a sus discípulos en pares.

Las indicaciones que les dio Jesús a sus setenta y dos misioneros refuerza la importancia de la comunidad. Jesús quiere que sus discípulos construyan relaciones saludables a donde quiera que vayan, deseando paz a sus nuevos conocidos, compartiendo los dones de fe y el sanar de enfermos, y aceptar la hospitalidad en cualquier forma que esta se ofrezca. Estos consejos prácticos todavía se aplican a nosotros hoy, los discípulos modernos de Jesús que trabajan en el mundo.
