GOD WORKS THROUGH PERSONAL INVITATIONS

DIANA SALGUERO'S SACRED STORY

Diana Salguero probably wouldn't have a close relationship with Jesus at all if it weren't for family members inviting her – sometimes a little forcefully! – to retreats where she encountered Him in profound ways. Her journey led her to volunteer at St Michael's and then a staff position as the Faith Formation Admin. She attributes it all to the people in her life who took the risk to share their own faith. Here's her Sacred Story:

Did you come from a faith-filled family?

No, I didn't! I'd say our family was the typical "culturally" Catholic Latino family. You know, it's tradition to go to church on Christmas and Easter, and you have to hit all those markers for Baptism, First Communion, Confirmation and such. For Christmas one year, I remember we even left church before Mass was even over because we had a big party to get to! Like we would be there for half the Mass. So yeah, it was all surface without any genuine spirituality. But when I was 17, that all changed.

Wow, what changed?

I was in Confirmation preparation classes and attended the retreat. This was still before we were really serious about religion, but my parents made me go. It was a mandatory activity. I mean, it was all fun and games and hanging out with friends and goofing around, so it was okay. I think I kind of saw it as a giant sleepover party. But then there was one evening with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and praise and worship, and I felt something - someone – filter through all the superficial social experience. I don't know how to describe it in words, but I just felt held there in that one pure moment. Like time stood still, and it wasn't that long, but it felt like an eternity. I remember tears rolling down my cheeks, and even though the moment didn't last, it was a curious hint, as if the Lord was saying, "Check this out. Come discover more!"

That sounds like a fantastic experience!

Yeah, definitely, but it wasn't

enough. I mean, it wasn't like that's all it took for me to instantly have a strong relationship with Jesus. I kind of resumed my teenage life a bit.

What did it take to get you more serious about the faith?

Funny thing, my Godmother invited my parents – who weren't really spiritual at all – to a Catholic retreat in Spanish called "Hijos de Maria Santísima" (Children of Holy Mary). She was the one who was like, "You guys should go to this retreat. It's going to impact you, change you and your family!" My parents did not want to go at all! They were all, "Yeah, no. Thank you, but no." My Godmother can be pretty persistent, though, and she kept emphasizing that they should at least try. It was a three-day retreat. They relented and went, probably just because there would be good food, and it would make my Godmother stop asking!

How did that go?

I remember my brother and I were



staying at my aunt's house while they were away, and when they came back from the retreat, they were completely different people. We went straight home to pray the rosary as a family, and I was so shocked. I didn't even know how to pray the rosary. It's nothing we had ever done before, individually or as a family. That retreat changed them so much that it was as if they were awakened after so long being asleep. It wasn't a temporary thing either. They continue to this day to grow in their faith.

How was that for you?

Honestly, I was annoyed! They had changed so much, and suddenly we're going to Mass every Sunday (for the whole Mass!) and praying together, and I didn't like the change. They kept bothering me to go on the next retreat. They wanted to share what they had, but I was rebellious. It got to the point that I told my parents out of anger, "I'm not going to that retreat. I'm going to become an atheist!" I look back on that and see how dumb I was, but that's where I was.

But you went to the retreat anyway?

Yes. My parents said, "Okay, it's up to you." And then, just one day after the next, I kept feeling that I should just give it a try. So I went, and it was everything that my parents said it would be! It's like that slight hint from my Confirmation retreat came flooding into my heart. Like the floodgates just broke open, and I was consumed by Jesus.

Wow, so the invitation was so important, wasn't it?

YES! God uses people to bring more people to Him. I got a kind of "direct" nudge at the Confirmation retreat, but it took my Godmother to maybe get out of her comfort zone to invite my parents to the other retreat. Then my parents had to share their experience with me before I felt compelled to go. We all need that little push because sometimes, most of us, are just so stubborn! Most of us won't act after just one little experience. We just move on. It takes other people to shove us a bit.

It's hard to share faith sometimes.

Oh, totally! It's a little weird, and I don't think many of us feel comfortable talking about our faith or inviting other people to churchy things. But I believe that when we do it anyway, the Holy Spirit can do the job. We should never feel embarrassed to share our personal stories. It can impact lives as it did with ours. Yeah, one person. That's all it took to change our whole family!

Now you're the youngest person on staff at St Michael's?

Yes, I'm 21 years old. God works so perfectly that you know, just it's crazy. I was volunteering in my brother's First Communion class and later was a catechist myself, and I just loved it. I really admired the dedication of the catechist team; they were so hard working

but making a huge difference in the lives of families and children. I have had other jobs waitressing and stuff, but I just felt like it wasn't my calling. When the opportunity opened to apply to be the Faith Formation Admin, I remember Glenda the DRE mentioned it easily three times. The first time I was like, "No, that can't be for me." Then the second time, it was, "Maybe." Then the third time, I felt like God was really insistently speaking! I applied and was selected for the job.

We are happy that you did! Do you have any final thoughts?

Well, if someone is inviting you to deepen your faith somehow, like asking you to attend an event or come to Mass or join a group, don't say "no" too quickly. Think about it and be open to the fact that maybe God is trying to reach you through them.

On the other side, never be embarrassed to share your personal faith story with someone. It doesn't mean you are being pushy. You will know when it's the right time and place. You never know how your faith will motivate and influence others to start their own walk to Jesus.

Thank you for being a beautiful inspiration!

DIOS OBRA A TRAVÉS DE INVITACIONES PERSONALES

LA SAGRADA HISTORIA DE DIANA SALGUERO

Diana Salguero probablemente no tuviera del todo una relación cercana con Jesús si no fuera por los familiares que la invitaron a asistir a retiros, ¡a veces un poco forzada! – Fue en estos retiros en donde Diana se encontró con El de una manera profunda. Su camino la llevó a ser voluntaria en St.Michael's y luego a ocupar un puesto como Administradora de Formación de Fe. Ella atribuye todo esto a las personas en su vida que se arriesgaron a compartir su propia fe. Aquí está su historia sagrada:

¿Vienes de una familia muy devota?

¡No, no fue así! Yo diría que nuestra familia era la típica familia latina católica "culturalmente". Ya sabes, es tradición ir a la iglesia en Navidad y Pascua, y tienes que cumplir con esos marcadores: el Bautismo, la Primera Comunión, la Confirmación y demás. Incluso recuerdo una Navidad en la cual nos salimos temprano de la iglesia, antes de terminar la misa, porque teníamos una gran fiesta a la que asistir, escuchamos nada más la mitad de la misa. De manera que todo era superficial sin ninguna espiritualidad genuina. Pero cuando tuve 17 años, todo

cambió.

Vaya, ¿qué cambió?

Estaba en clases de preparación para la Confirmación y asistí al retiro. En ese entonces no tomábamos en serio la religión, pero mis padres me obligaron a ir; no había otra opción, era obligatorio. Yo no me opuse porque lo vi como una gran fiesta de pijamas, era todo diversión y juegos y pasar el rato bromeando con amigos. Una noche hubo Adoración del Santísimo Sacramento, venerando y alabando al Señor y de repente sentí que algo, alguien, se filtraba a través de toda la experiencia social superficial. No sé cómo describirlo con palabras, pero me sentí retenida allí mismo, en ese momento puro, como si el tiempo se hubiera detenido; y no fue que pasara mucho tiempo, pero se sintió como una eternidad. Recuerdo que las lágrimas rodaban por mis mejillas, y aunque el momento no duró mucho, fue una insinuación curiosa, como si el Señor me estuviera diciendo: "Mira esto. ¡Ven a descubrir más!"

¡Suena como una experiencia fantástica!

Sí, definitivamente, pero no fue suficiente. Quiero decir, no fue como si eso hubiera sido todo lo que necesitaba para tener instantáneamente una relación fuerte con Jesús. Yo volví a reanudar un poco mi vida de adolescente.

¿Qué hizo falta para que tomaras en serio la fe?

Lo curioso es que mi madrina invitó a mis padres, que no eran nada espirituales, a un retiro católico en español llamado "Hijos de María Santísima" (Hijos de Santa María). Ella les dijo: "Ustedes deberían ir a este retiro. ¡Te va a impactar, te cambiará a ti y a tu familia!" ¡Mis padres no querían ir en absoluto! Le respondieron: "Sí, no. Gracias, pero no". Sin embargo, mi madrina puede ser bastante persistente y seguía enfatizando que al menos deberían intentarlo. Fue un retiro de tres días. Por fin ellos accedieron probablemente fueron solamente por la buena comida y para que mi madrina los dejara en paz.

¿Cómo fue eso?

Recuerdo que mi hermano y yo nos quedamos en casa de mi tía mien-



tras ellos estaban fuera; cuando regresaron eran personas completamente diferentes. Fuimos directamente a casa para rezar el rosario en familia y me quedé muy sorprendida. Ni siquiera sabía rezar el rosario porque no era algo que hubiéramos hecho antes, ni individualmente ni como familia. Ese retiro los cambió tanto que fue como si los despertaran después de tanto tiempo dormidos. Tampoco fue algo temporal porque hasta el día de hoy continúan creciendo en su fe.

¿Cómo fue eso para ti?

Honestamente, me fastidió bastante y no me gustó el cambio. Ellos habían cambiado mucho; ahora, de repente, íbamos a misa todos los domingos (¡Y, a la misa entera!) y rezamos juntos. Insistieron para que fuera al siguiente retiro porque querían compartir lo que ellos tenían, pero yo me rebelé hasta el punto que les dije con enojo: "No voy a ir a ese retiro. ¡Me voy a convertir en atea!" Ahora, al mirar hacia atrás veo lo tonta que fui, pero así eran las cosas en ese entonces.

¿Pero de todos modos fuiste al retiro?

Sí. Mis padres dijeron: "Está bien, es cosa tuya". Pero luego, poco a poco, día tras día, empecé a sentir que debería intentarlo y fui. ¡Todo lo que mis padres me habían dicho resultó cierto! Fue como si ese leve indicio de mi retiro de Confirmación regresara a mi corazón; como si las compuertas se abrieran y Jesús me consumiera.

Vaya, entonces la invitación fue tan importante, ¿no?

¡Sí! Dios usa a las personas para atraer a más personas hacia Él. Recibí una especie de empujón "directo" en el retiro de Confirmación, pero se requirió que mi madrina se saliera fuera de su ambiente normal para invitar a mis padres al otro retiro; luego, mis padres tuvieron que compartir su experiencia conmigo antes de que yo me sintiera obligada ir. Todos necesitamos ese pequeño empujón porque la mayoría de nosotros a veces somos muy tercos; no actuamos después de una pequeña experiencia y seguimos adelante, se necesita que otras personas nos empujen un poco.

A veces es difícil compartir la fe.

¡Oh, totalmente! Es un poco extraño, y no creo que muchos de nosotros nos sintamos cómodos hablando de nuestra fe o invitando a otras personas a las cosas de la iglesia. Pero creo que cuando al fin de cuentas lo hacemos, el Espíritu Santo puede hacer el trabajo. Nunca deberíamos sentirnos avergonzados de compartir nuestras historias personales. Puede impactar otras vidas como lo hizo con las nuestras. Sí, una persona. ¡Eso es todo lo que se necesitó para cambiar a toda nuestra familia!

¿Ahora eres la persona más joven del personal de St Michael's?

Sí, tengo 21 años. Dios trabaja tan perfectamente que es difícil de entender. Yo fui voluntaria en la clase de Primera Comunión de mi hermano y luego fui catequista, y me encantó. Realmente admiré la dedicación del equipo de catequistas; trabajaron muy duro, pero marca-

ron una gran diferencia en la vida de las familias y los niños. He tenido otros trabajos, como de camarera y otras cosas, pero sentí que no era mi vocación. Cuando se abrió la oportunidad de postularse para ser la Administradora de Formación de Fe, recuerdo que Glenda, el DRE, lo mencionó por lo menos unas tres veces. La primera vez dije, "No, eso no puede ser para mí". Luego, la segunda vez, fue "Quizás". Luego, la tercera vez, isentí que Dios estaba hablando con mucha insistencia! Solicité el trabajo y fui seleccionada.

¡Estamos felices de que lo hayas hecho! ¿Tienes algo más que añadir?

Bueno, si alguien te invita a profundizar tu fe de alguna manera; por ejemplo, pedirte que asistas a un evento o que vengas a misa o te unas a un grupo, no digas "no" de inmediato; piénsalo y acepta el hecho de que tal vez Dios esté tratando de alcanzarte a través de ellos.

Por otro lado, nunca te avergüences de compartir tu historia personal de fe con alguien. Compartir no significa que estés presionando a nadie; tu sabrás cuándo es el momento y el lugar adecuado. Nunca se sabe cómo tu fe motivará e influenciará a otros para que comiencen su propio camino hacia Jesús.



FIRST FRIDAY & FIRST SATURDAY

The First Friday devotion and the First Saturday devotion are both reparatory devotions in the Catholic Church that arose from separate private revelations. The First Friday devotion is associated with the Sacred Heart of Jesus, while the First Saturday devotion is associated with the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

Both devotions involve receiving Holy Communion on a certain number of consecutive first Fridays or first Saturdays of the month. The faithful prays for the particular intention of reparation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary, respectively. The devotions are similar in that they call on the faithful to "stand in the gap" by doing penance for sinners, and both give a special promise of Divine assistance at the hour of death.
