

## GOSPEL REFLECTIONS



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Jesus went to those most in need. He forgave the sinner, ate with the outcast, defended, and fed those who were poor and hungry. He worked for true justice, risked being unpopular, willingly accepted suffering and death, and always stayed connected with his Abba, Father. Jesus also consistently reminded folks that God's compassion, love, and mercy trump everything, even the law. This is the Christ that the Eucharist calls us to be. As we look around our churches, our towns and cities, and our world, there are many people who need to see the face and body of Christ. Some of those most in need may be right within our families. But it is always in the poorest of the poor and those most vulnerable that we find the greatest need. There are many who cannot function on their own. When the gift of the Eucharistic Christ takes root in our hearts, we can more readily see the face of Christ in others.

Many people are vulnerable. Highest on that list are the homeless. They show us the face

of Christ. Whatever the cause, to have no place to go and no place to call home takes a toll on the human spirit. For Jesus when there were hungry people, they were fed. God asks us to do the same ... feed people. There are many who are hungry physically, emotionally, and spiritually. Gifted by the Eucharistic presence of Christ, we can bring them Christ. Who are the hungry around us and how can we feed them?

When someone is hurting, you comfort them. When someone is hungry, you feed them. When someone needs clothes, you provide them. When someone is cold, you warm them. When someone is in prison, you visit them. With over a million people who are homeless and over a quarter of them children, it is important to ask the question, "why?" and strategize for ways to lessen or alleviate the problem. Nevertheless, we are not off the hook for responding to the immediate needs that present themselves at our doors. Whether a person's current station in life is self-imposed or the result of being

victimized, they are sacred vessels. We cannot lock the door and send them away and still believe we bear the Eucharistic presence of Christ. It doesn't work like that.

#### Psalm:


You are a priest for ever, in the line of Melchizedek. (Ps 110)

#### Gospel:

They all ate and were satisfied. (Lk 9:17)



## SACRED VESSELS

Have you ever paid attention to the purification of the sacred vessels after Holy Communion? If you haven't, I highly recommend doing so this Sunday. See the care with which the priest handles the chalice and the paten, pouring water into them to cleanse any loose particles of the Body and Blood of Christ. Observe the loving reverence he uses in wiping them dry with a special purifier. It's a ritual unto itself, and a powerful moment for reflection. These vessels begin as earthly objects. They are made by human hands. There is nothing special about them — not until they go about the work for which they have been created. Until they contain the Body and Blood of Christ, they are only ordinary objects. But after they have carried within them the Eucharist, they are never the same. They will always be special and deserving of special care.

That's why partaking of the Eucharist

is, for us, an evangelical undertaking. It is both a transformation and a declaration. When we accept this tremendous gift, we are proclaiming what we believe, and we are accepting the grace to follow through on that commitment.

When we are receiving the Eucharist, it is not possible for us to be passive. We become the vessel. We carry Christ into the world with us. But do we act like it? Do we treat ourselves — our bodies, our souls — with the same respect as the priest cleansing the chalice? Do we treat one another with the reverence we would reserve for a sacred object? When we look at another person with anger or irritation or envy, do we acknowledge the change that we have willingly undergone by receiving Christ's Body and Blood into ourselves?

### First Reading:

We hear in the reading from Genesis a victory meal of bread and wine between Abraham and Melchizedek, king of Salem. This is the Bible's first recorded meal of thanksgiving. Why do you think celebratory meals are so central to the storyline of the Bible?

### Second Reading:

In his letter to the Corinthians written around 55AD, Paul preserves for us the earliest attestation of the words Jesus spoke at the Last Supper. Jesus' institution of the Eucharist is core to our faith. Why do you think more Christians today do not appreciate the importance of this tradition?

### Gospel:

The miracle of the feeding of the 5,000 with loaves and fishes in many ways helps all believers understand how we need to be nourished by Jesus. In what ways does the Eucharist feed and sustain you in your daily life?



# MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO



Hoy celebramos la Solemnidad del Santísimo Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo. Fue el Papa Urbano IV que instituyó la festividad del Corpus Christi en el año 1264. Desde entonces hasta nuestros días, la Iglesia con gran fervor celebra junto con sus fieles esta Solemnidad. "La fiesta de Corpus Christi nos pide convertirnos a la fe en la Providencia, saber compartir lo poco que somos y tenemos y no cerrarnos nunca en nosotros mismos. La Eucaristía es el memorial del amor de Dios. Ahí se celebra el memorial de la pasión, del amor de Dios por nosotros, que es nuestra fuerza, el apoyo para nuestro caminar"... El Señor, no se olvida de nosotros y cada vez que vamos a él nos conforta con amor" (Papa Francisco).

¿Qué tal está el amor a la Eucaristía en mí? ¿Cuándo comulgo, lo hago con respeto y agradecimiento? La Eucaristía es un pan para

sobrevivir, para ayudar al más necesitado. Las palabras de Jesús en el Evangelio tienen mucho de este compromiso de compartir. "Denles ustedes mismos de comer" (Lucas 9:11). Sentimiento de solidaridad en nosotros, los seguidores de Jesús. Forma parte de la esencia de la fe, tanto en la sociedad como en la comunidad. Y, el Evangelio nos dice: "Todos comieron hasta saciarse. Después se recogieron los pedazos que habían sobrado, y llenaron doce canastos (Lucas 9:17). Aquí, el asunto es, que no se puede comulgar el Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo y seguir como si nada, viviendo egoístamente para uno mismo. Comulgar, es darse uno todito a los demás, ya sea en la familia, en el trabajo o en la universidad.

## RECIPIENTES SAGRADOS

¿Alguna vez has prestado atención a la purificación de los recipientes sagrados después de la Sagrada Comunión? Si no lo has hecho, te recomiendo que lo hagas este domingo. Observa el cuidado con el que el sacerdote maneja el cáliz y la patena, vertiendo agua en ellos para limpiar cualquier partícula suelta del Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo. Observa la reverencia amorosa que usa para secarlos con un purificador especial. Es un ritual en sí mismo y un momento poderoso para reflexionar. Estos recipientes comienzan como objetos terrestres. Están hechos por manos humanas. No tienen nada de especial, no hasta que realicen el trabajo para el cual fueron creados. Hasta que contengan el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo, son solo objetos ordinarios. Pero después de haber llevado dentro de ellos la Eucaristía, nunca vuelven a ser los mismos. Siempre serán especiales y merecen un cuidado especial.

Por eso participar de la Eucaristía es, para nosotros, una proeza evangélica. Es tanto una transformación como

una declaración. Cuando aceptamos este tremendo regalo, estamos proclamando lo que creemos y estamos aceptando la gracia para cumplir con ese compromiso. Cuando recibimos la Eucaristía, no es posible que seamos pasivos. Nos convertimos en el recipiente. Llevamos a Cristo al mundo con nosotros.

¿Pero actuamos así? ¿Nos tratamos a nosotros mismos, a nuestros cuerpos, a nuestras almas, con el mismo respeto que el sacerdote que limpia el cáliz? ¿Nos tratamos unos a otros con la reverencia que reservaríamos para un objeto sagrado? Cuando miramos a otra persona con enojo, irritación o envidia, ¿reconocemos el cambio que hemos experimentado voluntariamente al recibir el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo en nosotros mismos?

## SOLEMNITY OF MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS

June 24

The devotion to the Sacred Heart began with devotion to the Sacred Humanity of Jesus and to His Passion. His physical suffering on behalf of all of humanity, the shedding of His precious Blood for us, and His burning love for mankind. The image of the Sacred Heart consists of His Heart, wounded by the lance in His Passion, and precious drops of blood; it is surrounded by a crown of thorns, a cross, and is aflame.

## MEMORIAL OF THE IMMACULATE HEART OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

June 25

Honored alongside the Sacred Heart is Mary's Immaculate Heart, consisting of her contemplative, maternal heart, wreathed by a crown of roses, pierced with a sword, and alight with fire. The devotion to the Immaculate Heart was becoming popular around the same time as the Sacred Heart devotion. The visions of Mary appearing to St. Catherine Labouré in the 1800s and the subsequent propagation of the Miraculous Medal intensified devotion to the Immaculate Heart.

24 de Junio

La devoción al Sagrado Corazón comenzó con la devoción a la Sagrada Humanidad de Jesús ya Su Pasión. Su sufrimiento físico en nombre de toda la humanidad, el derramamiento de Su preciosa Sangre por nosotros y Su amor ardiente por la humanidad. La imagen del Sagrado Corazón consiste en Su Corazón, herido por la lanza en Su Pasión, y preciosas gotas de sangre; está rodeado por una corona de espinas, una cruz y está en llamas.

## MEMORIAL DEL INMACULADO CORAZÓN DE LA SANTÍSIMA VIRGEN MARÍA

25 de Junio

Honrado junto al Sagrado Corazón está el Inmaculado Corazón de María, que consiste en su corazón contemplativo y maternal, coronado por una corona de rosas, atravesado por una espada y encendido con fuego. La devoción al Inmaculado Corazón se estaba volviendo popular casi al mismo tiempo que la devoción al Sagrado Corazón. Las visiones de María apareciéndose a Santa Catalina Labouré en el siglo XIX y la posterior propagación de la Medalla Milagrosa intensificaron la devoción al Inmaculado Corazón.


