GOSPEL REFLECTION



St. Augustine tells us that a “Christian is a mind through which Christ thinks, a heart through which Christ loves, a voice through which Christ speaks and a hand through which Christ helps.” As we look around and out at the world, we do not have to search too far before we come face to face with inequity and injustice. There is so much unfairness, prejudice, anger, hatred, violence, and want. The stories of human heartache, people being hurt, deprived of life’s necessities, loneliness, and sickness are far too commonplace. For many of the world’s ills, the vices of greed, lust, pride, gluttony, and jealousy are clearly among the more significant root causes.

Why doesn’t God just step in and fix this mess? After all, God created this world, and one would hope that he would step up and take some measure of responsibility for it! Once we sit with this thinking for a while, we can begin to realize just how flawed it really is. God did take responsibility and God did fix the

problem! God sent us Jesus Christ as the divine solution to the world’s ills. It is not God who has shirked responsibility, we have. We are the ones who continually fail to set our own personal needs, wants, and securities aside so that One more powerful than us can use us.

Mary had to set her needs aside in order for the Son of God to come into the world. Put simply, Mary listened and believed. Having opened herself to being an instrument of the Divine, God could use her as his mind, heart, voice, and hand. She became God’s vessel so that God’s greatness could reach the ends of the earth and peace could come upon the world. God’s fix for the world’s difficulties is you and me. We are the ones who confess that Jesus Christ came into the world as the Son of God, the Prince of Peace, and herald of justice. All we have to do is believe, as did Mary, that what has been spoken to us by the Lord will be fulfilled. Then, we can step aside and be the Christians we claim to be. What a difference it

would make if every person who professed to be Christian truly understood that their one and only vocation is to be God’s instrument. What a beautiful, equitable, and just world it would be.



FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD CHALKING OUR DOORS

Weekend of January 1 – 2

Marking home lintels with blessed chalk in the new year is an old Epiphany tradition reminiscent of the Passover in the book of Exodus. “Chalking” your doorway places God at the entrance of your home, entrusting your entire family to His protection. All are welcome to pick up a bag of blessed chalk at the back of the church with the instructions and prayers on the weekend of Saturday, January 1 and 2 One bag per family, please.

The inscription we make this year is: 20 + C + M + B + 22

The “20” and “22” stand for the current year (2022). The plus signs represent the Cross of Christ. The CMB represents the traditional names given to the Magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar.



REFLEXIÓN DEL EVANGELIO



Tomar decisiones siempre es difícil; por muy simples que sean, lleva su tiempo de discernimiento. Hoy, la Liturgia se centra en María, y el Evangelio nos dice que: "Por entonces María tomó su decisión y se fue, sin más demora, a una ciudad ubicada en los cerros de Judá" (Lucas 1:39). Hacer la voluntad de Dios, como lo hizo la Madre del Señor, no fue cosa fácil. Al pronunciar su "sí", trajo consecuencias de fidelidad y servicio. "¿Cuáles eran sus pensamientos durante los meses de espera?" La respuesta proviene del pasaje de la visita de María a su pariente anciana, Isabel. "Entró en casa de Zacarías y saludó a Isabel". María estaba feliz por su maternidad, y a su vez, Isabel saludó a María diciendo: "¿Cómo he merecido yo que venga a mí la madre de mi Señor?" (Papa Francisco 12-23-2018).

Un diálogo de amor, entre estas dos mujeres, estalla en las montañas de Judea por el Mesías esperado. María acudió con prontitud, no con ansiedad, sino actuando como una verdadera discípula a su corta edad. La visita de María a su parienta Isabel debe ser un ejemplo vivo para prepararnos a vivir una Navi-

dad de dinamismo, fe y servicio hacia el más necesitado. Un encuentro de alegría auténtica, que manifieste la compasión y la ternura de Dios hacia los que nos rodean a través de nosotros. ¿Cuántos miembros de la familia sufren por falta de una visita, de un saludo? A tan solo unos días del nacimiento del Salvador, es el momento oportuno para las obras de caridad. ¡No pierdas la oportunidad! Camina presuroso al encuentro del Señor.


INSPIRACIÓN DE LA SEMANA

Marcar los dinteles de las casas con tiza bendita en el año nuevo, es una tradición antigua de la Epifanía que recuerda a la Pascua en el libro del Éxodo. "Marcar su puerta con tiza" coloca a Dios en la entrada de su hogar, confiando a toda su familia a Su protección. Todos están invitados a recoger una bolsa de tiza bendita en la parte de atrás de la Iglesia con las instrucciones y oraciones, el fin de semana del 1 y 2 de enero. Una bolsa por familia, por favor.

La inscripción que escribimos este año es: 20 + C + M + B + 22

El "20" y el "22" representan el año actual (2022). Los signos de suma (+) representan la Cruz de Cristo. El CMB representa los nombres tradicionales dados a los Magos: Gaspar, Melchor y Balthazar.

BABY JESUS' WISH LIST

Odds are you've got a Christmas list going by now — gift ideas for everyone from your nephew to your god-daughter to your mailman. But what about the birthday boy? What's the gift Jesus gets from you this Christmas?

If you've ever read the Book of Leviticus, you know all about the sacrifices God asks of the Israelites, referred to in the reading from Hebrews today. Leviticus can be a chore to read — a little repetitive, a little intimidating. There's a lot of very specific actions that God asks His Chosen People to complete to make up for whatever they have done wrong. In essence, it's a bit of a wish list for gifts.

But it's a wish list that can really confuse you. What's God going to do with a cereal offering? The kidneys of an animal? If you look closely, what God is doing here is beautiful. He's customized his wish list to only those things He knows the Israelites can give. It's God saying, in what amounts to theological baby-talk for folks who barely know of Him and His ways, exactly how they could be stewards. "Do this, but don't do that. If you do that, do this and you will find My mercy."

Our guide to stewardship — the Gospels of Christ — is less precise because by the time of Christ, God's people have grown in understanding of love and mercy and relationship with the divine. Through Christ, we find out that God's real



wish list didn't really consist of cereal offerings and the kidneys of various animals. It's far simpler, but luckily, it's something we still have on-hand.

All He wants is our whole heart.

LISTA DE DESEOS DEL NIÑO JESÚS

Lo más probable es que ya tengas una lista de Navidad: ideas de regalos para todos, desde tu sobrino hasta tu ahijada y tu cartero. Pero ¿qué pasa con el cumpleañero? ¿Cuál es el regalo que Jesús recibe de ti esta Navidad?

Si alguna vez has leído el Libro de Levítico, sabrás todo acerca de los sacrificios que Dios pide a los israelitas, a los que se hace referencia en la lectura de hebreos de hoy. Levítico puede ser una tarea difícil de leer: un poco repetitivo, un poco intimidante. Hay muchas acciones muy específicas que Dios pide a Su Pueblo Elegido que completen para compensar lo que sea que hayan hecho mal. En esencia, es una especie de lista de deseos para regalos.

Pero es una lista de deseos que

realmente puede confundirte. ¿Qué va a hacer Dios con una ofrenda de cereal? ¿Los riñones de un animal? Si miras de cerca, lo que Dios está haciendo aquí es hermoso. Ha personalizado su lista de deseos solo para aquellas cosas que sabe que los israelitas pueden dar. Es Dios diciendo, en lo que equivale a una charla teológica infantil para las personas que apenas lo conocen a Él y sus caminos, exactamente cómo pueden ser correspondables. "Haz esto, pero no hagas aquello. Si haces eso, haz esto y encontrarás Mi misericordia."

Nuestra guía para la correspondabilidad, los Evangelios de Cristo, es menos precisa porque para la época de Cristo, el pueblo de Dios ha crecido en la comprensión del amor, la misericordia y la relación con lo divino. A través de Cristo,



descubrimos que la verdadera lista de deseos de Dios no consistía realmente en ofrendas de cereales y los riñones de varios animales. Es mucho más simple, pero afortunadamente, es algo que todavía tenemos a mano.

Todo lo que quiere es nuestro corazón entero.
