

The Baptism of the Lord

Have you ever considered with whom Jesus spends most of his time? With whom he enjoys hanging out? Whom he considers his closest friends? They aren't the so-called "holy" people, but ordinary sinners like you and me. People who mess up, who need healing, who can't seem to get their act together.

Why does Jesus want to be with sinners? It's because his whole goal is to fulfill the Father's plan, not by being a messiah in the worldly sense, but by becoming the Messiah who bears all the consequences of sin by dying on the cross. That's what his mission, his entire reason for becoming man, was all about: to step into the place of sinners. He became a man so that he could know what it was like to be human in order to save humanity.

Jesus had a unique mission, one only he could fulfill. But have you ever stopped to consider that you have a unique mission as well? One only you can fulfill? It's true. Each of us has been created by God to carry out a mission designed for us alone. And just as Jesus was able to complete his mission through the power of the Holy Spirit, we receive that very same Holy Spirit when we are baptized and confirmed. Through the power of the Spirit given to us in the sacraments, we are anointed to carry out our mission as beloved sons and daughters of the Father.

First Reading Reflection [Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7](#)

Here again this Sunday, the prophetic voice announcing the coming of Christ is that of Isaiah, that wonderful book that is sometimes called "the fifth Gospel," so clear are the prophecies in it of the coming of Christ. As was noted in the study on Isaiah from Epiphany, these servant texts from Isaiah have often been read by Christians as referring both to Israel and the Jewish people and to the coming Messiah of Israel who is to

fulfill the role of his people perfectly. In the Gospel reading for this Sunday from Matthew we will see Jesus appear quietly at the Jordan, without clamor, as this text promises, to begin the work of fulfilling Israel's role of being a "covenant of the people, a light for the nations," and to bring those in the dungeon of sin out into the light of salvation. Since this reading is given us in the Mass, it is worth noting that, in response to this prophetic text from Isaiah, the Christians of the first centuries would sometimes call the Holy Eucharist that we still receive in Holy Communion simply "the covenant," to indicate that it was Jesus himself in the Eucharist that we receive,

the same Messiah that Isaiah had foretold.

Second Reading Reflection [Acts 10:34-38](#)

This text from Acts 10 represents a kind of half-way point in the narrative of Luke's Acts. In this chapter Peter receives the revelation that the Gentiles are to be included in "the Way" (Acts 9:2) that Jesus had instituted. This had already appeared in Acts 9 when a figure named Saul (later Paul) had been told by God that he would "carry my name before the Gentiles" (9:15). Here we see God prepare the Jewish Church for this transition through the leadership of Peter, the first pope. He first receives a vision in Joppa that makes clear that the dietary laws of Judaism, one of the clearest signs of difference between Jews and Gen-

tiles, have been fulfilled in the new revelation in Christ and need not be observed any more: "What God has cleansed, you must not call common" meaning, you must not disallow the consumption of foods which God has now declared acceptable).

Peter, at first perplexed at this, realizes the deeper meaning of this revelation when a Roman centurion (a Gentile, Cornelius) from Caesarea sends for him, so that he might hear Peter's gospel announcement. When Peter hears that this Gentile had received a revelation to call Peter, just as he had, the deeper meaning of his vision is made clear: "I see that God shows no

partiality. Rather, in every nation whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him.” Suddenly in the middle of Peter’s announcement of this Good News, the Holy Spirit falls upon these Gentiles as a corroboration of this message!

Gospel Reflection

Matthew 3:13–17

This wonderful feast of the Baptism of the Lord is part of a triptych of mysteries in the mind of the Church. In the Liturgy of the Hours for the celebration of the Epiphany, the antiphon for the Canticle of Mary (for Vespers or Evening Prayer) says, “Three mysteries mark this holy day: today the star leads the Magi to the infant Christ; today water is changed into wine for the wedding feast; today Christ wills to be baptized by John in the river Jordan to bring us salvation.” That prayer suggests that the mystery of the magi celebrated last Sunday on the Epiphany is continued in another “epiphany” in this feast of the Baptism of the Lord. That word in the Greek

means “a showing forth” and the thing shown here is the Christological mystery of our faith, that Jesus is the Incarnate Son of God and the second Person of the Most Holy Trinity. All three divine Persons are present in the tableau that we see both here and in Luke’s gospel, the voice of the Father, the dove as a sign of the Holy Spirit and, of course, the presence of the Son in the waters of the Jordan. This revelation that the one God is a loving communion of three Persons that Jesus came to disclose is what the Catechism calls the “central mystery of Christian faith and life” (CCC 234). By our Baptism we enter that mystery of the Son, overshadowed by the Spirit we become the favored sons and daughters of the Father.

Digging Deeper True God and True Man

“The unique and altogether singular event of the Incarnation of the Son of God does not mean that Jesus Christ is part God and part man, nor does it imply that he is the result of a confused mixture of the divine and the human. He became truly man while remaining truly God. Jesus Christ is true God and true man. During the first centuries, the Church had to defend and clarify this truth of faith against the heresies that falsified it.” —CCC 464

Prayer

In the second reading from Paul, we are told that “after the baptism that John preached...God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power. He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him.” Now apply those words to yourself: “After my baptism, God anointed me with the Holy Spirit and power. I go about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God is with me.” What do you feel as you hear those words applied to you? Do you truly believe that you have been anointed by the Holy Spirit? Do you trust that God is with you? Let the truth of this statement take root in your heart and say to yourself, “God is truly with me.”

Resolution

This week, trusting that you have been anointed and empowered by the Holy Spirit through your Baptism and Confirmation try your best to explain what the Church really teaches the next time you hear someone misunderstand or even misrepresent Catholic doctrine.

Fr Carl's Message

A “Maintenance” Church or a “Mission” Church?

Father James Mallon, diocesan priest from Nova Scotia, has a book entitled Divine Renovation: from Maintenance to Mission. He starts with his observation and experience that parishes around the world are emptying, aging, sleeping, dying. For years – even decades – they have allowed themselves to fall into a “maintenance” model and have forgotten the mission.

What does a maintenance church look like?

1. Parishioners go to Mass and follow a patterned routine, with bare minimum effort.
2. Zero evangelization effort, and all energy focuses on those inside the church and neglecting those outside.
3. Leadership aims to just make people happy, without rocking the boat and certainly without challenging anyone.
4. Ministries and groups who haven’t invited new members and are therefore dwindling.
5. Lack of happy faces, joyful exuberance and energy.

Do we want St Michael’s to look like this kind of maintenance church? I believe this is not the direction that God desires for us. Matthew 28:20 always reminds us to go out through all the world to tell the Good News and make disciples. God wants us to be in Church where we can use our gifts and talents for the spread of

the Good News and to humbly submit to the direction and guidance of our Bishop and Pastors. Even our Church Leaders need also to be aware of this direction and pursuit towards an evangelizing and missionary church.

But here is the hope:

Our ministries of charity, such as St Vincent de Paul, Homebound Ministry, Drive Through Prayer, Grief Support and our parish volunteers who serve meals at St Mary’s Center and Open Heart Kitchen are just a few, touch lives



with the mercy of Jesus. Our welcoming ministry, liturgical ministers and all parishioners who warmly smile and greet people make Jesus present. Our Parish Prayer Team and all of our devotional groups who pray for our community connect us to the Lord.

But I must ask you to take a step further:

Invite as many people as you can to Alpha which starts on February 10. Alpha is a series of dinners

perfect for those who don’t consider themselves “religious” people. It’s a non-intimidating event that might be an easy entry into exploring Christianity. You and your guests will be greeted by friendly people and have dinner around a table of fun people. On the first night, you’ll watch an engaging video asking the question, “Is there more to life than this?”. Then you’ll have a chance to discuss it amongst your tablemates. Alpha offers a welcoming environment to take the first small steps toward encountering Jesus. Alpha is also perfect for people who are returning to the Church, for people who have a lot of “head” Christian knowledge, but not “heart” and for Catholics who are looking for a community of friends.

Please see page 6 of this bulletin. Cut out the Alpha invitation and give it to someone. Everyone is welcome to attend: parishioners or non parishioners, religious or non-religious. No matter where you are on the spiritual journey, Alpha is for everyone.







¿Una iglesia de "mantenimiento" o una iglesia de "misión"?


