# Sunday Readings

## TRUE HAPPINESS

### FIRST READING

*You humble of the land, seek justice and humility, and the Lord will be your protection (Zephaniah 2:3; 3:12-13).*

The idea of the remnant is a continuing theme in the prophetic book. The remnant isn't simply a limited number of survivors of some catastrophe that awaits in the future, but what has been described as an eschatological remnant that not only survives, yet continues to do so because its members are holy. This idea passes into the Christian age through St. Paul, who identifies those Jews who accept Christ as the faithful remnant of the true Israel onto which the Gentiles are grafted in a new Israel. It's this remnant that makes it possible for God to remain true to his covenantal promises and yet deliver justice to the sinner.

Within the covenant there's always a universal promise of blessing, but there's also implied a particular application of the promise made to all. That is, to receive what's promised to all, one must struggle to be numbered among the remnant of the true Israel which is "a people humble and lowly." As has often been said, God's justice and mercy are one and the same thing. The unrepentant experience it as the justice meted out on "the day of the Lord" while the righteous receive the blessings of his sheltering mercy in the covenant to which they have been faithful.

### SECOND READING

*God chose the weak of the world, those who count for nothing, so that whoever boasts should boast in the Lord (1 Corinthians 1:26-31).*

This section of Paul's letter to the Corinthians is a perfect fit with the theme of the lowly and humble remnant mentioned above, which will be described as those blest in the Gospel just following. It has always been one of the most salient characteristics of Christianity that appeals to the lowly. That's one of the causes of its rapid spread in disparate places such as ancient Rome and modern India. The low-born plebeians and slaves of the Roman empire found that they were as welcome amongst the Christians as the high-born patricians, and they spread the faith throughout the world. Likewise, the low caste peoples of India, the so-called "untouchables," are embraced by the Christian community to the point that the majority of Indian Catholics are from those castes.

To this very day, St. Paul's words sound as though he's speaking directly to the average Catholic in the pew: "Not many of you are wise, as men account wisdom; not many are influential; and surely not many are well-born."

### GOSPEL

*Jesus taught from the mountain: Blessed are the poor in spirit (Matthew 5:1-12a).*

The goal of life in Christ is beatitude, blessing. That story needs so much to be told. So many think that the moral life consists entirely of following laws. One who lives life in Christ

will certainly be law abiding. But as the introduction to this section of the Catechism makes clear, our faith, celebrated in the sacraments, brings us into a new life of grace which expresses an inner impulse to do all that Christ has commanded and to love in the measure that he loved—that is, without measure. It's the grace of the sacraments which gives us this life, which is why in the Catechism's first article on the sacraments, it says that the whole of God's plan is "one vast divine bless-

ing" and that "in the Church's liturgy, the divine blessing is fully revealed and communicated" (CCC 1079,1082).

The life of Christ, or perhaps, rather, the life of Christ in us, leads us to live as he did. The Beatitudes describe everything that he was. Whether the least or the greatest, when we live this blessed life we do come to know him. Knowing him, we love him and our neighbor all the more.

## MEDITATION

Imagine that you are seated on the hillside, listening to Jesus preach. Now you hear him say, "Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted." What goes through your mind when you hear these

words? In what area of your life are you mourning? How do you think that God can comfort you in your sorrow?

Next, you hear Jesus go on to say, "Blessed are the meek, / for they will inherit the land. / Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, / for they will be satisfied. / Blessed are the merciful, / for they will be shown mercy. / Blessed are the clean of heart, / for they will see God. / Blessed are the peacemakers, / for they will be called children of God. / Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, / for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. / Blessed are you when they

insult you and persecute you / and utter every kind of evil against you falsely because of me."

Which of these statements do you find the most challenging? Which of these teachings do you think Jesus might be asking you to practice more in your life right now?

# Reminders

## How to Receive Holy Communion

The Eucharist is the source and summit of our faith: the most precious center point of our lives. As Catholics, we understand that the Eucharist is the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus. Therefore, receiving Eucharist must be done so with the highest form of reverence:

- Approach with a bow
- When the minister says "The Body of Christ" or "The Blood of Christ", respond clearly with AMEN.
- If receiving in the hand, support one hand under the other. Lift your hands at chest level.
- If receiving on the tongue, slightly tilt your head, open wide and extend your tongue.
- Consume the Eucharist immediately.

Note: We never "take" Communion. We "receive" Communion. This verb choice will help keep us in the correct mind-set.



Some serious sins include (but are not limited to) being married outside the church, being unmarried but living together or purposely not attending Sunday Mass or holy days of obligation. God's mercy and love await you in the Sacrament of Confession!

### CUESTIONES DE PODER


De todas las lecturas de hoy, especialmente la del Evangelio de Mateo, afirma que Dios honra a los pobres y a los humildes, y promete la bendición de Dios en el reino proclamado por Jesús. Muchos de aquellos que Jesús encontró, y luego Pablo, pensaron que esos

dichos acerca de los mansos heredarian la tierra era una tomada de pelo. ¿No era obvio que el "poderoso", con poder militar, económico y social, son los que se encargan de las cosas? Pablo parece decir que primero debemos entender la naturaleza y el propósito del poder. A causa de Cristo, el poder que surge de estructuras humanas egoístas se desvanecerán tarde o temprano. El poder duradero viene solo de Dios, el poder que provee cuidado por los demás y reconcilia las divisiones entre nosotros. El poder del mundo es de valor verdadero, pero solo si se ejecuta responsablemente, al servicio solo de los propósitos de Dios. Este es el tipo de poder que al final es el que importa.

Los mansos y puros de corazón parecen entender esto de manera muy clara. Porque ellos están libres de la carga de proteger su propio poder, ellos pueden revelar más plenamente la verdad del poder de Dios.

### EL SIGUIENTE PASO

¿Qué se requiere para ser pobre de espíritu y de corazón puro? El Evangelio de hoy presenta el Sermón de la



Montaña (Mateo capítulo 5 al 7) explora esto en detalle. El Sermón sugiere que aprender a abrir nuestros corazones para confiar en Dios es fundamental.
