Sunday Readings ...

Persistence in Prayer by Opening the Word

First Reading

As long as Moses' hands were kept uplifted, Joshua and his men had the better part of the battle with Amalek (Exodus 17:8-13).

Time and again in history, Israel falls into idol worship of the gods of the Canaanites. Amalek's grandparents (Esau and his Canaanite wife) would've symbolized unfaithfulness to God, and he himself was the fruit of an illicit union between his father and biological mother. It'd be fair to say that Amalek and his descendants represented all that was corrupting Israel. If Israel failed to be true to God, it couldn't be a light to the other nations as God intended. There was a lot at stake on the battlefield in this Exodus reading.

The scene portrayed to us shows that the only way to drive out this corrupting influence from the Promised Land was by divine intervention, symbolized by the raising of the staff of God in the hands of Moses. Later, the raising of a staff with a bronze serpent on it will drive away the poison of those snakes for those who looked upon it and, still later, the raising of Christ on the cross will drive out the sin and death for those who look upon him. If we find the treatment of the Amalekites troubling, we'd do well to

remember that in Christ we see that God will stop at nothing to work for our salvation.

Second Reading

Second Reading -- Remain faithful; proclaim the word; be persistent whether it is convenient or not (2 Timothy 3:14 -- 4:2).

The commission which St. Paul gives to Timothy as a member of that second generation of Church leaders is a serious one. Paul exhorts Timothy

to do the work
of
the



Gospel in the hope that Timothy will be as tireless as a bishop as Paul the apostle. With a solemn oath he says, "In the presence of God and Christ Jesus...proclaim the word; be persistent whether it is convenient or inconvenient; convince, reprimand, encourage through all patience and teaching."

The tools necessary for this arduous task are mentioned by Paul: faithfulness to the teaching received from the apostles of Christ and the sacred Scriptures. We see here mentioned the two fountainheads of the one fount of divine revelation, Tradition and Scripture. St. Paul suggests that the whole energy for Timothy's mission of evangelization depends on

faithfulness to tradition and faith in Christ revealed in Scripture. He says specifically that the study of Scripture will leave the disciple “competent, equipped for every good work.” In order for the work of God to be fruitful it must be fueled by the Word of God.

Gospel Reading

God will secure the rights of the chosen who call out day and night (Luke 18:1-8).

The need to pray is always linked to Jesus’ description of the events leading up to “when the Son of Man comes,” or end of time when Christ will come again. Understanding the context of this passage helps us to see that constancy in prayer isn’t simply a requirement so that the petitioner will get what he or she wants. Rather, constant prayer ensures that we’ll be on the side of God’s justice when he comes because our prayer is a demonstration of faith. It takes faith to pray, and faith is the means to our justification, holiness, and righteousness in the sight of God. In order for Jesus to find justice, righteousness, or holiness when he comes again as judge of the living and the dead, believers must be steadfast in prayer.

So Jesus isn’t so much suggesting that we nag God until we get what we want, as is sometimes thought, but that we pray often, indeed constantly, so that we’ll be the holy, faith-filled people he longs to find upon his return. Otherwise, his justice can only work to our disadvantage. What’s just for the sinner and just for the righteous are two

very different things, and it’s prayer in faith that makes the difference.

Meditation

In the parable in today’s Gospel reading, Jesus teaches us about the importance of persistence in prayer. As we take time to pray and meditate on this Scripture, let’s keep in mind that we are created for communion with God, and that prayer prepares us for the perfect communion we will have with him in heaven.

Prayerfully place yourself in today’s Gospel reading. Imagine that you are the widow, persistently bringing your request before the unjust judge. How do you feel presenting your request over and over again? What motivates you to be persistent? Now imagine that instead of petitioning an unjust judge, you are bringing your request before the most honest, just, and merciful judge, God himself. How do you feel presenting your petition now?

Remember MATA

Prayer can be difficult for many people. Remembering the acronym MATA is helpful: Mercy, Asking, Thanksgiving, Adoration.

“ Prayer is both a gift of grace and a determined response on our part. It always presupposes effort. The great figures of prayer of the Old Covenant before Christ, as well as the Mother of God, the saints, and he himself, all teach us this: **prayer is a battle**. Against whom? Against ourselves and against the wiles of the tempter who does all he can to turn man away from prayer, away from union with God. ”

— *Catechism of the Catholic Church*

Mercy: Call upon God’s endless love and mercy. Beginning with mercy reminds us that we have no reason to worry when we approach God.

Asking: Ask for gifts for yourself and for others! God delights in our trust in Him.

Thanksgiving: God is so good, and the only response we can give is “thank you!”

Adoration: Simply being with God is the most important part, because it is in this time that God forms and perfects us. Adoration brings us into communion with the Father through the Son.

God Will Always Say YES to These Prayers

In his book, *Ten Prayers God Always Says Yes To*, Anthony DeStefano explains that prayer is not a magical formula. Rather, prayer is about being aware of God's presence and choosing to participate in your relationship with Him. He identifies ten prayers that are irresistible to God, prayers He will always answer with "yes".

- 1) God, show me that you exist
- 2) God, make me your instrument
- 3) God, outdo me in generosity
- 4) God, get me through this suffering
- 5) God, forgive me
- 6) God, give me peace
- 7) God, give me courage
- 8) God, give me wisdom
- 9) God, bring good out of this bad situation
- 10) God, lead me to my destiny

Fr Mike's 4 Tips for Praying

Fr Mike Schmitz posted a video on Ascension Press about these 4 tips for developing a rich prayer life:

When: Decide when you will pray each day, and build your day around it. Make it a set time that defines your whole day.

Where: Choose a place or a few places that is not too distracting, but not so quiet and comfy that you fall asleep!



What: Pick a style or tradition of prayer and stick with it for about 4 weeks. Give yourself permission to switch it up after committing to one type for a season.

Why: Prayer isn't only to give you answers and consolation. Your "why" should be to deepen your relationship with the God who is pursuing you!


3rd Annual St Michael School Walk-a-Thon Friday, October 21


Bilingual Mass of Remembrance Monday, October 24 at 7:00 pm St Michael Church

The sacrament that helps unite those who are suffering with Jesus' saving and healing power is the Anointing of the Sick. Through this sacrament people receive forgiveness for their sins and comfort in their suffering; they are restored in spirit; and sometimes they even experience the return of physical health. Suffering is a part of life, but Jesus unites our suffering with his passion and death so that through our suffering we can participate in his saving and healing work. The sacrament also reminds us that God wants to give comfort to the suffering and wants us to relieve suffering where we can.

In the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, the priest anoints the seriously ill, injured, or the elderly with the oil of the sick.

LUCHANDO BATALLAS

En el libro del Éxodo se describe una batalla. Mientras otros están en el campo de batalla, Moisés permanece en lo alta de una colina y pese al cansancio y con ayuda, él sostiene sus manos levantadas en actitud de oración, asegurando la victoria. Es su perseverancia, su paciencia, su persistencia para permanecer en esa posición pese al esfuerzo, lo que resultó en victoria. Timoteo le recuerda a su comunidad que ellos, y nosotros, debemos ser persistentes al proclamar la palabra. Lucas cuenta la historia de una viuda y un juez deshonesto. Ni siquiera sabemos cual era el pleito. Lo único que sabemos es que la viuda no va a descansar hasta que ella reciba justicia y finalmente así pasa. Lo que todas estas lecturas tienen en común es la actitud de la perseverancia enfrentando posibilidades inesperadas.

RENDICIÓN VICTORIOSA

Todos hemos tenido nuestras batallas, en el trabajo, en los juzgados, en nuestros corazones y mentes. Quizá ganamos unas y perdemos otras, pero pocas tuvieron que requerir la persistencia evidenciada en Éxodo y en Lucas. ¿Somos capaces de dicha persistencia? Quizás lo somos si la batalla es por algo vital, importante, y estamos dispuestos a luchar sin importar lo que cueste con tal de ganar. ¿Pero qué sería aquello por lo que luchemos? Así como el salmo lo dice claramente, Dios es capaz de tal persistencia, especialmente cuando aquello que es importante y vital para Dios somos nosotros. Dios es la viuda perseverante y nosotros somos el juez deshonesto. Dios es Moisés permaneciendo firme pese al cansancio. Somos tan importantes para el plan de salvación de Dios que nada se interpondrá en el camino de Dios que nos salvaguarde, ni siquiera nuestras



debilidades, defectos y pecados. Como el juez deshonesto, debemos rendirnos y aceptar el amor persistente y apasionado de Dios.
