

# Resisting Temptation

We begin the season of Lent by joining Jesus in the desert where he is tempted by the devil. Satan tempts Jesus in three ways, which represent the same three tactics he commonly employs today to get us to break our relationship with God.

First, Satan tries to undermine Jesus' identity as the Son of God. He does the same thing with us—he tries to undermine our dignity and identity as sons and daughters of God. Second, Satan offers Jesus the kingdoms of the world. Satan tempts us too to seek power and influence in this world in order to further enslave us in an endless quest for control.

Finally, Satan tempts Jesus to fulfill his mission in a way other than the one ordained by the Father. In the same way, we are often tempted to find an easier or more "successful" way to live our lives, instead of trusting the Father's plan.

Jesus answers Satan in all three of these temptations with the Word of God because God's Word has power to resist and overcome evil. That is one reason why it is so important to become steeped and grounded in Scripture: in order to have a ready sword of truth which we can use to defend ourselves against the lies and snares of evil. Let us now join Jesus in the desert in this week's Gospel reading and learn how we can better resist the temptations of the devil in our own lives today.

## Unpack the First Reading Deuteronomy 26:4-10

This Lenten season begins with the recounting of the first fruits offering that was commanded of Israel before entry into the Promised Land. We're reminded



that to enter into the promises of Easter, we must offer the best of ourselves in the coming Lent.

The first fruits offering wasn't simply a kind of bribe given to God in return for fertility as was often the case in other cultures. The offering was divided among the priests, the poor, and aliens; it was an act of almsgiving. For Israel, the first fruits offering was a collective act of humility and charity. In this ritual act that led to the feeding of the poor and the alien, Israel said, in effect, "There, but for the grace of God, go I."

We have the same need as Israel to recognize that what we have is a gift. We have been given the

Promised Land that is the Church through no merit of our own. In this Lenten season one of the ways that we express our gratitude to God for his gifts to us is by being generous to the poor and the alien.

## Unpack the Second Reading Romans 10:8-13

One can convey a lot of meaning with a few words. Certain words can carry a great weight of meaning. Many terms St. Paul uses in this reading are charged with meaning and weight because they allude to events from the Old Testament. To take just one example, Paul begins by contrasting the righteousness that comes from the Law and the righteousness that comes by faith. The term "righteousness" in Hebrew is "zedek." In ancient times it meant that you were a legitimate heir or descendent. To be "righteous" meant that you had a right to inherit the throne. But "righteousness" can also mean acting justly or doing the right thing. One would be said to be just or righteous if he obeyed the Law of God and lived in accord with the Covenant.

So a proper conception of the term "righteousness" combines the two ideas contained in the one, weighty word. We receive the gift of being righteous (or rightful) heirs by faith in Christ, and we keep our place in the inheritance by righteous acts of faith, working in love under the influence of God's grace.

## Unpack the Gospel

Luke 4:1-13

Luke was interested in changing the way the Hellenistic (Greco-Roman) people saw themselves and the world by showing that Jesus is the definitive key to not only the Jewish story but also to the whole human story. So for Luke it's particularly important to show that Jesus is the new David, a new king of which the world ought to take note. One of the parallels between David and Jesus can be seen in our Gospel reading this week.

In 1 Samuel 16:13 we're told that the Holy Spirit rushes upon David after he's anointed by the prophet Samuel, and then later David fights and defeats Goliath. In Luke's Gospel, the Holy Spirit descends upon Jesus in the Jordan after he's baptized, and then he later fights and defeats Satan in the desert.

It's important for us to remember that in Jesus, we too are connect-

ed to the people of Israel. We re-live that 4,000 years of their struggle in the 40 days of our Lenten season, just as Jesus re-lived that struggle in his 40 days in the desert. In him the Jewish story becomes our story. In him we hope for the Easter victory that heralds the salvation story for the whole world.

### For Discussion

The Scripture Readings for today focus on the temptations of Jesus, but even more, they speak to us of the power God gives us to overcome evil. Begin your exploration of these passages by watching the short ***Opening the Word*** video found on FORMED.org.

Based on the video presentation by Mary Healy, what are the three ways Satan tempted Jesus? And how does Satan use the same three tactics to tempt us today?"

As we saw in the Gospel reading and heard in the presentation, Jesus responded to temptation

using the Word of God. How are the Scriptures an important weapon and defense in our battle against temptation?


### Priest, Prophet, King Lent Study

The devil tells you that (1) you are not really a child of God; (2) you can have anything you want in the world by turning away from God, and (3) you don't have to follow God's plan for your life but can choose an easier way instead. How would you respond to each of these temptations?

Prayerfully consider which of these temptations is most difficult for you to resist. Why is it? What can you do this week to resist this temptation more in your life?

# Scandals in the Church Call for a Time of Purification



**D**ear St Michael Family,  
Our Bishop has released  
the names of diocesan  
priests and religious who have  
been credibly accused of sexual  
abuse against minors (see  
[www.oakdiocese.org/credibly-accused](http://www.oakdiocese.org/credibly-accused)). I am saddened, angry  
and frustrated by the news, as I am  
sure you are too. Although many of  
the abusers are dead or have been  
defrocked from their clerical state,  
the pain and horror at the grave  
sins committed by religious leaders  
remains with us. This  
is a global crisis in the Catholic  
Church, and new reports of clergy  
accused of sexual misconduct  
seem to be surfacing regularly.

How should we respond to this  
terrible crisis?

Firstly, our Bishop, our diocese  
and our parish are determined to  
protect our children. Protocols for  
clergy, staff and volunteers have  
been established to ensure the safe  
environment of children. The Diocesan  
Victims Assistance Ministry  
offers a variety of avenues for vic-  
tims and family members to report  
their experiences, to be welcomed,  
to receive pastoral care, and to  
learn about and access much-

needed services. For more information on our diocese's policies and procedures that all leaders must follow, please visit [www.oakdiocese.org](http://www.oakdiocese.org)

Secondly, at our parish, I commit to the following during the season of Lent:

1. *After the homily at daily and weekend Masses*, the presider will invite the congregation to kneel to pray one Hail Mary for the healing of the victims of clergy abuse and for the purification of the Church.
2. *Listening sessions with me, Fr Carl*, will be offered on March 18 and 25, 9:30-10:30 am and April 1 and 8, 6:30 -7:30 pm in the Convent Chapel followed by a prayer service as an opportunity to voice concerns about this crisis.

This is indeed a challenging time for our Church. It is also a time for holy purification, especially for those in leadership in our Church. God will use this tragic time to transform the Bride of Christ. I believe that despite this crisis, we still have many good and holy priests, deacons and bishops and religious among us. Please support them with your prayers and support their effort to fulfill the mission entrusted to them by Christ.

## Priest Prophet King Lent Study

Until the Fall, Adam, the first priest, walked in easy fellowship with God in the Garden of Eden, in *adoratio*. The root of "adoration," *adoratio* means "face to face" and describes the vocation of a priest, living in communion with God and seeking to intercede

for the people through sacrifice. Through our Baptism, we are also called to be priests, not ordained, but living in communion with God and seeking to draw others to him through our sacrifices of love.



# Rites of Scrutiny

“ The Scrutinies, which are solemnly celebrated on Sundays and are reinforced by an exorcism, are rites for self-searching and repentance and have above all a spiritual purpose. The Scrutinies are meant to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the Elect [those preparing for Baptism at Easter Vigil]; to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good. For the Scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the Elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth, and the life. These rites, therefore, should complete the conversion of the elect and deepen their resolve to hold fast to Christ and to carry out their decision to love God above all.” RCIA 141

## Invitation to Silent Prayer

One of the most powerful moments of the Scrutinies is how they begin. After the homily, the Elect are invited to come forward with their sponsors and



to kneel down. Then, the whole assembly is invited to pray for them in silence. It is a very solemn moment. This community has cared for these Elect for months to years on their journey. We have sent them to reflect more and more deeply on the Word of God, and expressed to them our longing for the day on which they would join us at the table of the Lord. Now we pray for them in this sacred silence, deeply asking God to protect them and heal them in the weeks ahead.

## Intercessions for the Elect

We then pray out loud together for the Elect.

## Prayer of Exorcism

Then, we pray that they might be freed from the power of the Evil One and protected on their journey.

## The Laying On of Hands

In a silent ritual deliberately reminiscent of the rite used for ordination in the Sacrament of Holy Orders, the priest or deacon lays his hands for a brief moment on the head of each of the Elect. It is a solemn act of calling down the Ho-



ly Spirit to be with them and protect them.

## Dismissal of the Elect

The Elect are then sent forth to reflect upon the Word and this powerful gesture of love on the part of this community, that cares for them so deeply, with the love of Christ.

# Escándalos en la Iglesia piden un tiempo de purificación

**Q**uerida familia de San Miguel,

Nuestro obispo ha revelado los nombres de sacerdotes y religiosos diocesanos que han sido acusados de abuso sexual contra menores (ver [www.oakdiocese.org/credibly-accused](http://www.oakdiocese.org/credibly-accused)). Estoy triste, enojado y frustrado por las noticias, como estoy seguro de que usted también. Aunque muchos de los abusadores han muerto o han sido expulsados de su estado clerical, el dolor y el horror por los graves pecados cometidos por los líderes religiosos permanece con nosotros. Esta es una crisis global en la Iglesia católica, y nuevos informes de clérigos acusados de conducta sexual inapropiada parecen estar apareciendo regularmente.

¿Cómo debemos responder a esta terrible crisis?

En primer lugar, nuestro obispo, nuestra diócesis y nuestra parroquia están decididos a proteger a nuestros niños. Se han establecido protocolos para el clero, el personal y los voluntarios para garantizar un entorno seguro para los niños. El Ministerio Diocesano de Asistencia a las Víctimas ofrece distintas maneras para que las víctimas y los miembros de la familia informen sus experiencias, sean bienvenidos, reciban atención pastoral y conozcan y accedan a los servicios que necesitan. En segundo lugar, en nuestra parroquia, me comprometo a lo siguiente durante la temporada de Cuaresma:

1. Después de la homilía en las misas diarias y de fin de semana, el que preside invitará a la congregación a arrodillarse para rezar un Ave María por la curación de las víctimas del abuso del clero y por la purificación de la Iglesia.

2. Las sesiones para escuchar conmigo, el Padre Carl, se ofrecerán los días 18 y 25 de marzo, de 9:30 a 10:30 y los días 1 y 8 de abril, de 6:30 a 7:30 pm en la Capilla del Convento, seguido de un servicio de oración. como oportunidad para expresar preocupaciones sobre esta crisis.

Este es ciertamente un tiempo desafiante para nuestra Iglesia. También es un momento para la purificación santa, especialmente para los líderes en nuestra Iglesia. Dios usará este tiempo trágico para transformar a la Novia de Cristo. Creo que a pesar de esta crisis, todavía tenemos muchos buenos y santos sacerdotes, diáconos, obispos y religiosos entre nosotros. Por favor apóyelos con sus oraciones y apoye sus esfuerzos para cumplir la misión que Cristo les encomendó.

## Sacerdote, Profeta, Rey

Hasta la caída, Adán, el primer sacerdote, caminaba en fácil comunión con Dios en el Jardín del Edén, en adoración. La raíz de la "adoración", adoratio significa "cara a cara" y describe la vocación de un sacerdote, viviendo en comunión con Dios y buscando interceder por el pueblo a través del sacrificio. A través de nuestro Bautismo, también somos llamados a ser sacerdotes, no ordenados, pero vivien-

do en comunión con Dios y buscando atraer a otros a través de nuestros sacrificios de amor.




