

GOSPEL REFLECTIONS



PEACE BE WITH YOU

Jesus tells his disciples, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you." The peace that Jesus gives is far different than the kind that comes from the absence of war, conflict, or affliction. The peace that God offers is found alongside suffering and hardship, not necessarily in their absence. St. Teresa of Avila offers us a bit of wisdom regarding peace: "May today there be peace within. May you trust God that you are exactly where you are meant to be. May you not forget the infinite possibilities that are born of faith. May you use those gifts that you have received and pass on the love that has been given to you. May you be content knowing you are a child of God. Let this presence settle into your bones and allow your soul the freedom to sing, dance, praise, and love. It is there for each and every one of us."

In order for us to experience the divine peace that Jesus offers, we have to allow God's presence to settle into our bones! It is only when this happens that we can be truly taught by the Holy Spirit to discern the true path to peace and find ourselves with

untroubled hearts. The world and our lives are so unpredictable and changeable. If we look for a source of lasting and real peace only there, our search will never be satisfied. Something will always unsettle and disturb us. The Jewish disciples could really relate to what Jesus was saying about peace (shalom). They already knew that it was more a matter of achieving wholeness and wellbeing than anything else.

Wholeness and wellbeing are precisely what is uncovered when we begin to really see and know the height, depth, and breadth of God's presence and promise. The elegance of God's Divine life flows through our blood and the marrow in our bones. It is that close and deep. As we breathe in and exhale God's life, peace becomes what we know within and what is exhaled out. This remains in the midst of intense conflict, persecution, suffering, rejection, and even death.

LET ALL THE NATIONS PRAISE YOU!

Psalm 67

If you've ever worked in any kind of organization, for-profit or not-for-profit, I'm sure you have attended a conference or two. Whatever our expectations going in, I usually find these conferences expose me to communication and problem-solving styles that are different from my own, nudging me into a little unexpected self-discovery. And it's a great opportunity to meet new people and do something different.

Here's my idea for a leadership conference: The Management Style of the Apostles. Think about it, the only thing the Apostles had more abundantly than holiness was problems. Lots and lots of problems ... most of them of the human resources variety. It's no small feat, starting Christ's Church on earth. I wouldn't want to be project manager of that endeavor.

The Acts of the Apostles is, in some ways, a big book full of problems and ways to solve them. It's a blueprint for tackling interpersonal issues in the manner of a true steward, who encounters every problem starting from the same

place: What would my Master want? It's a question we should be asking ourselves every time we, too, encounter a problem — especially problems relating to other people. What is the truth in this situation, and how would God have me communicate it? How could I handle this in a way that is worthy of the name of my Master?

In Acts, we see a lot of characteristics of everyday stewardship. We see the Apostles mindfully acknowledge the lack of peace that is posed by problems like false teachings, this Gospel's problem du jour. They prayerfully confront the obstacles to salvation posed by these issues. Always, always, always, their main objective is to reveal the will of God, remaining committed to the truth while helping newcomers find avenues to salvation.

Maybe I'm just saying it because it's my idea — but it sounds like a conference we could all use.

Second Reading:


One of John's final visions depicts the heavenly Jerusalem where God's presence is fully known in all its splendor. Why do you think this vision of heaven was revealed to John?

MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO



"Jesús promete a los Apóstoles el don del Espíritu Santo, cuya tarea será enseñar y recordar sus palabras a la comunidad de discípulos. Enseñar y recordar: esto es lo que hace el Espíritu Santo en nuestros corazones" (Papa Francisco). Es muy cierto y se tiene la experiencia, de que, la persona que se abandona al Espíritu Santo, da muchos frutos de continua enseñanza y de obras buenas que el Espíritu de Dios hace en ella. Los santos y santas lo han experimentado en sus vidas, mostrando su fe con hechos. El amor de Dios nunca se cansa, si está presente, suceden cosas maravillosas.

"El que ama verdaderamente a Dios, observa sus mandamientos y Dios entra en su corazón y ahí permanece, porque el amor de Dios llena de tal manera su corazón, que al tiempo que le da tentación, no vuelve a su vida pasada" (San Gregorio Magno (540-640) Homilia 30). El reto, en este Sexto Domingo de Pascua, es que continuemos abriendo nuestro corazón y mente a la paz y al amor del Señor. Esa paz y su amor ayudarán a sanar las heridas sufridas por falta de amor, y quitará el miedo que se arraiga

en la vida de la persona, a causa, muchas veces, de la falta de Dios en su vida. "Les dejo la paz, les doy mi paz, la paz que yo les doy no es como la que da el mundo. Que no haya en ustedes angustia ni miedo" (Juan 14:27). Oh, bien. "Si alguien me ama, guardará mis palabras" (Juan 14:23). Nuestra tarea: siempre tener la esperanza de enseñar y recordar todo lo que hemos recibido de Dios a los que nos rodean.

Administración según los apóstoles
Si alguna vez has trabajado en cualquier tipo de organización, con o sin fines de lucro, estoy seguro de que has asistido a una conferencia o dos. Cualquiera que sean nuestras expectativas, por lo general encuentro que estas conferencias me exponen a estilos de comunicación y resolución de problemas que son diferentes a los míos, empujándome a un poco de autodescubrimiento inesperado. Y es una gran oportunidad para conocer gente nueva y hacer algo diferente. Esta es mi idea para una conferencia de liderazgo: El estilo de administración de los apóstoles. Piénsalo, lo único que los Apóstoles tenían más abundantemente que laantidad eran los problemas. Muchos, muchos problemas...la mayoría de ellos de la variedad de recursos humanos. No es poca cosa, comenzar la Iglesia de Cristo en la tierra. No quisiera ser gerente de proyecto de ese esfuerzo.

Los Hechos de los Apóstoles es, en cierto modo, un gran libro lleno de problemas y formas de resolverlos. Es un plan para abordar los problemas interpersonales a la manera de un verdadero corresponsable, que se

encuentra con todos los problemas comenzando desde el mismo lugar: ¿Qué quería mi Maestro? Es una pregunta que deberíamos hacernos cada vez que también nos encontramos con un problema, especialmente problemas relacionados con otras personas. ¿Cuál es la verdad en esta situación y cómo quiere Dios que la comunique? ¿Cómo podría manejar esto de una manera que sea digna del nombre de mi Maestro?

En Hechos, vemos muchas características de la corresponsabilidad diaria. Vemos a los Apóstoles reconocer conscientemente la falta de paz que plantean problemas como las enseñanzas falsas, el problema del día en este Evangelio. En oración enfrentan los obstáculos que ponen para la salvación estos problemas. Siempre, siempre, siempre, su principal objetivo es revelar la voluntad de Dios, permaneciendo comprometidos con la verdad y ayudando a los recién llegados a encontrar caminos hacia la salvación. Tal vez solo lo digo porque es mi idea, pero parece una conferencia que todos podríamos usar.


DISTRIBUTED GROCERIES

3,758 Households

10,815 People

Livermore residents continue to struggle with food insecurity. But this quarter, our volunteers from St Michael's and friends from throughout the city served 1,500 hours to distribute fresh produce, protein and pantry staples to 3,758 households (10,815 people!) We are grateful to have been awarded a grant from the Alameda County Community Food Bank to purchase a three-door refrigerator and a three-door freezer. We also installed a new storage unit outside the hall to house them, making food distribution easier.

St Michael Community Care, in partnership with the Alameda County Community Food Bank, distributes groceries on Saturdays from 9 am - 11 am. Volunteers also deliver food to those who are homebound. Signup to volunteer at StMichaelLivermore.com/Groceries



RENT & UTILITIES ASSISTANCE

22 Families

Total of \$8,081

For the first quarter of 2022 we finically assisted a total amount of \$8,081. This amount assisted 22 families or individuals with rent, utilities, and other needs such as assisting an elderly couple to buy a new window for their mobile home after it got damaged due to being broken into.

We also provided 105 families with food. We serve anyone in need at Livermore and can call for assistance from our helpline number 925-758-0126.



Everyone wants to experience peace. When we look to the world to provide this for us, we can easily get disappointed. We associate peace with an absence of war and conflict, good relationships between neighbors and coworkers, the achievement of success and even the absence of noise! While all of these are worthy endeavors, pursuing them exclusively as a path to experiencing peace sets us up for failure. When we look for peace outside of ourselves, it will never be found. True and lasting peace is something that comes from within and not something we can produce on our own or receive from others. Peace is discovered when we experience an inner wholeness and harmony. It is born of a sense of connectedness with a God who is larger and greater than ourselves, gifting us with His presence. It is the only the peace offered by the Risen Christ that can settle our hearts and calm our fears. Regardless of the degree of turmoil around us, this sense of completeness that Jesus gives anchors our boats and prevents us from sinking.
