

We have the ability to walk with joyful hope! Jesus, during his earthly ministry, pointed the way to God's kingdom. What is finally understood about God's kingdom is that it is filled with the glory of Christ! We are all in the process of being emptied into and becoming one with Christ. We are new creations, clothed in Christ, made in God's very image and likeness, and on this incredible journey of glory. The Ascension allows us to see this truth about ourselves and it enlightens our hearts. Christ who was most perfectly, vividly, and brilliantly transfigured before the very eyes of the disciples will be our destiny. Seeing only imperfectly now, we will see perfectly then. We will bask in the brilliance of understanding and truth. Christ is our destiny and our hope. Alleluia!

Believing this with our whole heart allows us to walk proudly through life's darkness. There is so much that can upset us and weigh us down. Sometimes, life's news can not only be challenging but downright discouraging. Our own lives can easily become unsettled and empty. We rely too much on the things of this world to please us and wonder how we lost our excitement, enthusiasm, wonder, and joy. Getting so caught up in superficialities and unnecessary dependencies, we lose our axis, anchor, and center. Today, we can claim it back again! We are reminded that it is not here that we find fulfillment but in the world of Christ yet to come. Jesus sent this promise of his Father upon his disciples, and he sends it to us as well.

Faith in God really has power to change things. In essence, all we have to do is believe in what God promises. God is ever close to us. He can even use what we see as the "useless scraps of life" to create "God moments" of inspiration and invitation. Then, even what is perceived as unpleasant, distasteful, or even hurtful can be transformed into an experience of joy. The Ascension of Christ becomes our reference point for self-knowledge. This firm anchor allows us to work through whatever comes our way and never be robbed of joy!

FAMOUS LAST WORDS

A fun way to waste an hour or two on the internet is to Google "famous last words." There are entire websites devoted to chronicling the last utterances of celebrities and historical figures. I think the fascination with parting words stems from the drama of a person's final moment on earth. We want to ascribe some kind of power and significance to the last words they say, especially if they are our loved ones, because it gives us something to carry with us in our grief.

In Jesus' case, every word he ever said had power and significance, but especially those he said before ascending into Heaven: "You will be my witnesses ... to the ends of the earth."

And then he was gone. If I were one of the Apostles, I think a small anxiety attack would have commenced at that point. As

much as they knew and believed that Christ was still with them, it must have felt awfully lonely standing there staring at an empty sky, with the mother of all homework assignments having just been handed down.

Stewardship is intimidating by nature. The baptismal call is an honor and a gift. But it is also a little scary bearing witness to Christ.

When we doubt ourselves, let's return to Christ's last words and cling to the faith he had in his Father's love for us. He says not "you will be witnesses" but "you are witnesses." We already have what we need. God is within us, and we take Him wherever we go.

Maybe I'm just saying it because it's my idea — but it sounds like a conference we could all use.

QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

First Reading:

In his final words spoken to the apostles before he ascended into heaven, Jesus commissioned them to bear witness to his life, death, resurrection, and ascension. When have you borne witness of your faith in Jesus to others?

Second Reading:

Paul teaches the Ephesians that in his resurrection and ascension, Jesus now resides in heaven with the Father and with complete authority and power, and the Church is his body here on earth. How often do you think about your faith community in this way?

Gospel:

The ascension of Jesus is repeated as both the final episode in the Gospel of Luke and the opening scene in the Acts of the Apostles. Why do you think Jesus' ascension was so important to Luke, who authored Acts?



MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

¿QUÉ HACEN mirando al cielo?



Hoy celebramos la Solemnidad de la Ascensión del Señor al Cielo. Casi se cumplen 50 días de la Resurrección. Escuchamos en la Liturgia de la Palabra como en distintas ocasiones el Señor se apareció a sus discípulos. Él ha dejado su testamento a ellos y a nosotros también. "Predicar el Evangelio". Ser sus testigos y dar testimonio de su amor. Así, de sencillo, es el compromiso, aunque abarca un cambio de vida radical. No puede haber medida en las cosas de Dios. "Llena, Señor, nuestro corazón de gratitud y de alegría por la gloriosa ascensión de tu Hijo, ya que su triunfo es también nuestra victoria, pues donde llegó él, nuestra cabeza, tenemos la esperanza cierta de llegar nosotros, que somos su cuerpo (Oración Colecta).

En su catequesis sobre esta Solemnidad, el Papa Francisco nos explica que: "Con su Ascensión, el Señor Resucitado atrae nuestra mirada al Cielo. Para mostrarnos que la meta de nuestro camino es el Padre. En la Solemnidad de la Ascensión, renovemos el compromiso de testimoniar. Se trata de ser hombres y mujeres de la Ascensión, es decir, buscadores de Cristo en los caminos de nuestro tiempo, llevando su palabra de salvación a los confines de la tierra. Jesús, se va, asciende al Cielo, es decir, regresa al Padre de quien fue enviado al mundo. Hizo su trabajo, luego regresa al Padre. Pero no es una separación, porque permanece con nosotros para siempre. En una forma nueva". Miremos a las alturas, pero no nos quedemos mirando sin hacer nada. Que nuestro objetivo, claro, sea mirar al cielo, pero tener los pies en la tierra, haciendo siempre la justicia para el más necesitado. ¿Lo harás?

Evangelio:


Mientras los bendecía, se fue apartando de ellos y elevándose al cielo. (Lc 24:51)



"Que todos sean uno, como tú, Padre, estás en mí y yo en ti" (Juan 17:21). Qué gran alegría la oración sacerdotal de Jesús en este VII Domingo de Pascua. Nos encomienda al Padre y nos revela su amor, por medio de la unidad y la promesa de la gloria que se nos ha dado gracias a su resurrección. Jesús nos amó hasta el extremo y el Padre nos ama igual. Es una oración que llena de esperanza al creyente, para no abandonar la fe y la nueva vida prometida. Jesús pide por todos, para ser protegidos ante el peligro de separarse de la fe. La finalidad es permanecer unidos mutuamente.

El Papa Francisco, en su catequesis sobre la oración Sacerdotal, nos ayuda a reflexionar en un punto muy importante: "Esto me parece lo más bonito para recordar. Esta es la última catequesis de este ciclo dedicada al tema de la oración. Recordar la gracia de que nosotros no solamente rezamos, sino que, por así decir, hemos sido "rezados", ya somos acogidos en el diálogo de Jesús con el Padre, en la comunión del Espíritu Santo. Jesús reza por mí. Cada uno de nosotros puede colocar esto dentro del corazón, no lo olviden, también en los momentos más difíciles". Dijo el Santo Padre: "El Apóstol San Juan en el libro del Apocalipsis lo expone de la siguiente manera: "¡Ven! Que el que escucha diga también: ¡Ven! El que tenga sed, que se acerque y el que lo deseé, reciba gratuitamente el agua de la vida"" (Apocalipsis 22:17). ¿Cómo es tu fe y tu oración? ¿Sientes que respondes a Jesús, en su petición al Padre, de permanecer unidos en el amor?




DISTRIBUTED GROCERIES

**3,758 Households
10,815 People**

Livermore residents continue to struggle with food insecurity. But this quarter, our volunteers from St Michael's and friends from throughout the city served 1,500 hours to distribute fresh produce, protein and pantry staples to 3,758 households (10,815 people!) We are grateful to have been awarded a grant from the Alameda County Community Food Bank to purchase a three-door refrigerator and a three-door freezer. We also installed a new storage unit outside the hall to house them, making food distribution easier.

RENT & UTILITIES ASSISTANCE

**22 Families
Total of \$8,081**

For the first quarter of 2022 we finically assisted a total amount of \$8,081. This amount assisted 22 families or individuals with rent, utilities, and other needs such as assisting an elderly couple to buy a new window for their mobile home after it got damaged due to being broken into.

We also provided 105 families with food. We serve anyone in need at Livermore and can call for assistance from our helpline number 925-758-0126.



SAINT OF THE WEEK | SANTA DE LA SEMANA



ST. JOAN OF ARC | MAY 30

St. Joan of Arc (1412 – 1431) has had her story told throughout history through many books, movies and plays. She was born in the village of Domrémy, near the province of Lorraine, to a French peasant family. At a young age, she began to experience visions and voices, which were later identified to be of St. Michael, St. Catherine of Alexandria, and St. Margaret of Antioch. At the age of 13, all three saints told her that she was to drive the English from French territory, and that she must bring the Dauphin to Reims for his coronation. Trusting in God, she did as she was told.

During the Hundred Years War, St. Joan of Arc led French troops against the English and recaptured the cities of Orléans and Troyes. Captured near Compiegne the following year, she was sold to the English and placed on trial for heresy and witchcraft, eventually being found guilty and burned at the stake in Rouen.

St. Joan of Arc was canonized by Pope Benedict XV on May 16, 1920, and is the patron saint of military members.

ST JUANA DE ARCO | 30 DE MAYO

Santa Juana de Arco (1412 - 1431) ha tenido su historia contada a lo largo de la historia a través de muchos libros, películas y obras de teatro. Nació en el pueblo de Domrémy, cerca de la provincia de Lorena, en el seno de una familia campesina francesa. A una edad temprana, comenzó a experimentar visiones y voces, que luego se identificaron como las de San Miguel, Santa Catalina de Alejandría y Santa Margarita de Antioquía. A la edad de 13 años, los tres santos le dijeron que debía expulsar a los ingleses del territorio francés y que debía llevar al Delfín a Reims para su coronación. Confiado en Dios, hizo lo que le dijo.

Durante la Guerra de los Cien Años, Santa Juana de Arco dirigió las tropas francesas contra los ingleses y recuperó las ciudades de Orleans y Troyes. Capturada cerca de Compiègne al año siguiente, fue vendida a los ingleses y juzgada por herejía y brujería, y finalmente fue declarada culpable y quemada en la hoguera en Rouen.

Santa Juana de Arco fue canonizada por el Papa Benedicto XV el 16 de mayo de 1920 y es la santa patrona de los militares.


