

GOSPEL REFLECTIONS



"Our families need to ask for the gift of the Spirit! Through prayer, even in the busiest times, we give time back to God, we find the peace that comes from appreciating the important things, and we encounter the joy of God's unexpected gifts. Through daily prayer may our homes become, like the house of Martha and Mary, places where Jesus always finds a warm welcome (Pope Francis)." While it is necessary to attend to the details of hospitality, learning how to be present to people, experiences, and God is sometimes more important. Creating homes that are welcoming environments requires not only organization and structure but members who truly enjoy being there and celebrating life with one another.

Details can often get the best of us. While attending to details is important to success, our obsession with them can be problematic. Whether wanting to make a good impression, fear of failure, insecurity, or emotional immaturity, throwing ourselves into the "details" of hospitality can distract us from being present to those we want to serve. Conversely, focusing exclusively

on being present without any attention to detail also sets our attempts at hospitality up for disaster! We need a balance of both. But creating a truly welcoming space in our homes and within ourselves requires still more.

We have to be empty of ourselves. Becoming a welcoming, hospitable person is not possible in someone focused on their own needs and desires. If the one we serve is the one who looks back at us in the mirror, then there is no space for anyone else. While Martha and Mary had different ideas of what it means to serve, they both had the inner space and freedom to do so. They were detached from themselves. Detachment becomes the challenge to hospitality and creating a God-centered, open-hearted space in our lives. When we impulsively act out of our personal agendas, violence, abuse, pride, greed, lust, power, control, passion, and self-aggrandizement encroach upon the space needed to be present to another human being. Not only can others not find a home in us, but even God cannot find a home in us!

BE READY FOR GOD TO "STOP BY"

In my experience, most people can be divided into two groups: those who are old enough to remember when you kept food on hand for company, and those who aren't. For those of you in the latter group, let me explain. Before text messaging and social media made us all unconditionally, mercilessly reachable, people would do this thing called "stopping by." They would be passing by a friend's house, maybe on the way home from work or shopping, and they would just ... stop. With no warning. No notice whatsoever. "I was just in the neighborhood," they would say. I remember my mother and I would do this on many a Saturday. It wasn't an everyday occurrence, but it was common enough that you had to be ready.

"Crazy," you might exclaim. "People just appeared on your doorstep? How did you cope with the uncertainty?" Well, most of us had moms who kept a little something on hand to eat or

drink that was extra nice, just in case anyone stopped by. That way, we were always ready.

Today's readings are about a lot of things: prayer, hope, redemptive suffering. They're about what it means to be a Christian, and not just what it means to do Christian things. Most of all, though, they're about readiness. If God showed up at your door, would you be ready for Him? Would you be ready for what He gives you, or what He takes away? Would you be ready for Him to interrupt the plans you have for yourself? To disrupt the idea you carry in your mind of what a servant or a steward is supposed to be?

Read your Bible. Say your rosary. Go to Mass. Get to Confession. Talk to God — every day, not just when you think you need Him. That way, you are always ready.

MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO



Nos pasamos nuestra vida, desde que tenemos uso de razón hasta el final de los días, tratando de elegir lo mejor, ser lo mejor, vestir y comer lo mejor. Grandes pensadores, filósofos y consejeros, por mencionar algunos, escriben libros, dan conferencias con la misma meta y siempre con el mismo objetivo: "Que sepamos elegir en la vida lo mejor". El domingo pasado escuchábamos como el buen samaritano y el posadero hicieron lo mejor para el pobre hombre que fue asaltado en el camino. Hoy, la Liturgia nos presenta otra escena en el Evangelio de Lucas: ¿Cómo saber elegir lo mejor?

Jesús, nos narra el Evangelio... entró a un pueblo donde vivían Marta y María, quienes lo recibieron en su casa. Ambas mujeres, me imagino, conocían a Jesús. Este es un punto interesante, ya que Martha eligió la

parte del trabajo, sin fijarse en la importancia del invitado. Iba y venía atendiendo los quehaceres, sin prestar la mayor atención. Hasta que de repente, notó que su hermana estaba muy sin prisa, sentada a los pies de Jesús, escuchándolo. Es por esta razón que Martha se atreve a reclamar a Jesús: "Señor, ¿no te importa que mi hermana me haya dejado sola para atender? Dile que me ayude. Pero el Señor respondió: Marta, Marta, tú andas preocupada y te pierdes en mil cosas: una sola es necesaria. María ha elegido la mejor parte, que no le será quitada" (Lucas 10,40-42). Nadie nos separará del amor de Cristo, y ese amor nos hará perfectos, dice San Pablo.

Según mi experiencia, la mayoría de las personas pueden ser divididas en dos grupos: los que tienen la edad suficiente para recordar cuándo se tenía comida a mano para las visitas y los que no.

Para aquellos de ustedes en el último grupo, déjenme explicar. Antes de que los mensajes de texto y las redes sociales nos hicieran a todos accesibles incondicionalmente y sin piedad, la gente hacia esto llamado "pasar por aquí." Estaban pasando por la casa de un amigo, tal vez camino a casa del trabajo o de compras, y simplemente... se detenían. Así sin advertir. Sin aviso alguno. "Solo estaba en el vecindario," decían. Recuerdo a mi madre y a mí hacer esto en muchos sábados. No era algo que ocurriera todos los días, pero era lo suficientemente común como para que tuvieras que estar preparado. "Que locura," podrías exclamar. "¿Las personas solo se aparecían en tu puerta? ¿Cómo lidiaste con la incertidumbre?" Bueno, la mayoría de nosotros teníamos mamás que tenían a mano algo para comer o beber que era muy agradable, en caso de que

alguien pasara por allí. De esa manera, siempre estábamos preparados.

Las lecturas de hoy son sobre muchas cosas: la oración, la esperanza, el sufrimiento redentor. Se trata de lo que significa ser cristiano, y no solo de lo que significa hacer cosas cristianas.

Sobre todo, se tratan de preparación. Si Dios apareciese en tu puerta, ¿estarías listo para Él? ¿Estarías listo para lo que Él te diera, o para lo que Él te quitara? ¿Estarías listo para que Él interrumpiera los planes que tienes para ti? ¿Para interrumpir la idea que llevas en tu mente de lo que se supone que es un servidor o un corresponsable?

Lee tu Biblia. Reza tu rosario. Ve a Misa. Ve a la Confesión. Habla con Dios, todos los días, no solo cuando creas que lo necesitas. De esa manera, siempre estarás listo.
