

St Michael Catholic Church Reopens for Public Mass

Beginning June 19, 2020, Solemnity of Most Sacred Heart of Jesus

Dear Parishioners,

Thank you for your prayers and patience. God is good! We are now moving to Phase 3 under the guidance of Bishop Michael Barber and Alameda County Health Department, to reopen public Mass beginning on June 19, the Solemnity of Most Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Because we are limited to 80 people in the church, we will require that everyone make a Mass reservation at least 24 hours in advance. This will ensure that people are not gathering in large crowds and will ensure our compliance with the number of people we can allow at Mass Additionally, every Mass throughout the week will include the Sunday Mass readings, to offer the largest possible access to the Sunday celebration, so it is not required that you attend Mass on a Sunday. I ask you, in your kindness, to please only reserve one Mass per week, so that as many members of our community can attend in person.

Please remember that Bishop Michael Barber has offered a dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass. We will also continue to livestream Mass on Facebook and YouTube. If you are sick or have been sick over the past couple of weeks or at a higher risk for COVID 19, you are encouraged to pray the Mass from the safety of your home.

I ask you to please be patient, flexible and compassionate with our clergy, staff and volunteers as we all get used to these new procedures. Our aim is to offer as many people the joy of worshiping together in person, while also keeping our community safe and in compliance with the Alameda County Health Department.

MASS ATTENDANCE PROCEDURE

Before Mass

Make a Reservation

To ensure that we do not exceed the limited capacity in the church, and that no one is turned away at the door, each person attending Mass will need to have a reservation at least 24 hours in advance.

Please only reserve one Mass per week, to allow as many people as possible the opportunity to attend Mass in person.

There are three ways you can make your Mass reservation:

Temperature Check at Home

Before coming to church, please do a self-temperature check. Those with a fever above 100.4 degrees should stay home.

Gather Worship Aids

If you like to follow along with the prayers at Mass, bring your own worship aids such as Magnificat. There will not be missalettes or hymnals available in the church.

Wear a Face Covering

Guided by Alameda County Health Department, those over age 12 are required to wear a face covering that covers the nose and mouth. Alameda County gives an exception for those who have conditions that cause breathing difficulty. Children under age 2 should not wear a face covering.

About the Liturgy

Limit to One Mass

In your kindness, please limit yourself to attending Mass once per week to allow everyone an opportunity to celebrate in person. It's important to know that our normal weekend Mass attendance is 2,500 people.

Like Sunday Every Day

To allow as many people as possible to pray and reflect upon the Sunday Mass readings in person a, every Mass celebrated throughout the week will include the Sunday Mass readings.

Offertory

Parishioners and guests can place their offering in the boxes located at both the exits to the breezeway and Fourth Street, before or after Mass.

Presentation of the Gifts

To reduce contact, the presentation of the gifts has been removed.

Our Father

Holding hands during the Our Father originally is not part of the Catholic Liturgy or in the Holy Mass. Avoid holding hands with people next to you.

Sign of Peace

During the Sign of Peace, we will offer peace in the silence of our hearts, without physical contact.

Communion

Communion will take place <u>AFTER</u> Mass to allow those who are watching live from home to drive to the courtyard and to receive inside the Church.

Communion may be received either by kneeling or standing in front of the ordinary minister.

The Precious Blood (Cup) will not be available.

The faithful are strongly encouraged to receive Communion in the hand without wearing gloves.

Reverently approach the sanctuary wearing a face covering. Make a head bow. Place one hand under the other while keeping fingers together and receive the host. After receiving the host, step aside, lower/lift face covering and consume.

Exit immediately after Communion.

Arriving at Church

Arrive Early

Please arrive 15 minutes early to allow time to park and check in.

Park in the Church Parking Lot or Side Streets

Our Parking Lot volunteers will direct you.

Keep Moving

Please move promptly to and from the church, as we must not gather outside.

Entrance and Check in



Arrive at the main (Maple Street) entrance of the church with your party, maintaining 6 feet social distancing and face coverings are required. Those with mobility limitations may enter at the breezeway door. A volunteer will check your reservation and offer hand sanitizer (if you have not brought your own). An usher will escort you and your group to an available pew. Members of one household may sit together in one pew, no more than 6 people in a large pew and no more than 4 people in a small pew.

Exit

Side doors are only for exiting.	Maintain 6 feet social distancing upon entering and exiting.

Holy Water

Our holy water fonts will be empty for safety. The faithful may bring their own vessel to fill from the container located at the breezeway door.

6-Foot Social Distance

While seated, standing and walking, people who are not in the same household must remain 6 feet apart from each other.
